

# CRC Internship Program Information sheet and application

Interns train primarily by observing CRC workshops in progress at schools and other sites. They participate gradually in facilitation until they get to the point of being facilitators on their own. We try to match the responsibilities with the interests of the interns.

# **Criteria For Accepting Interns**

- Ability to work with children.
- Understanding and acceptance of nonviolence theory. Nonviolence requires tremendous strength and discipline. It is not "softness".
- Ability to work experientially (necessary to put CRC techniques into practice).
- Commitment to nonviolent social change.

### **Internship Term**

Three months to two years, depending on the person's experience and abilities.

# **Workshop Responsibilities**

- Facilitating small groups within the workshops.
- Helping to gather materials for use with activities.
- Writing group responses (such as in brainstorming) on board or newsprint.
- Working toward a goal of facilitating workshops independently.

#### **Administrative Duties**

CRC members share administrative duties. The intern would be expected to participate in such support work at least half time.

This includes:

Typing and filing

Research

**Phoning** 

Filling orders for publications, etc.

Correspondence

All of the above would be under supervision.

#### **Some Expectations**

Interns will be expected to arrive at meetings and workshops on time.

A serious attitude and commitment to the project is expected.

Interns are expected to have the ability or the potential to hold the attention of a group of children and sustain it in a creative way. By the end of the internship, the intern should feel comfortable in taking the main responsibility for conducting workshops.

It would be expected that the intern would have a strong desire to find work in which the CRC skills acquired as an intern could be utilized.
